ESSENTIAL QUESTION: What makes a person healthy? Is healthcare a right or privilege?

DESCRIPTION

Health is the ability of an individual and community to adapt to physical, environmental, and social changes. Conflicts around health equity stem from differences in belief and values about what rights humans are entitled to. The financial, physical, and emotional costs of supporting quality individual and community health can be extensive.

The Health 'n Justice project will explore the biological and philosophical elements of health equity culminating in a community panel run by students. Research conducted during the semester will also be published in a book including individual, community and international health issues.

- Is healthcare a right or a privilege?
- Under what circumstances are we obligated to help other people? Does it matter whether we know
 those people or not? Does it matter whether they live in our local community, nation, or another
 country?
- What makes a person healthy and how are those needs met?
- How do our interactions with our environment and other people impact our health?
- What scientific developments and medical practices can address these needs?
- What social institutions are needed to allow people access to these scientific developments and medical practices (e.g. the free market or public healthcare)? What role, it any, should philanthropy play?
